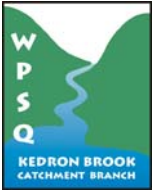
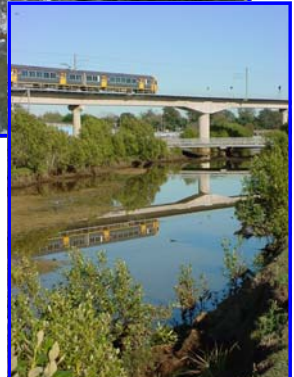
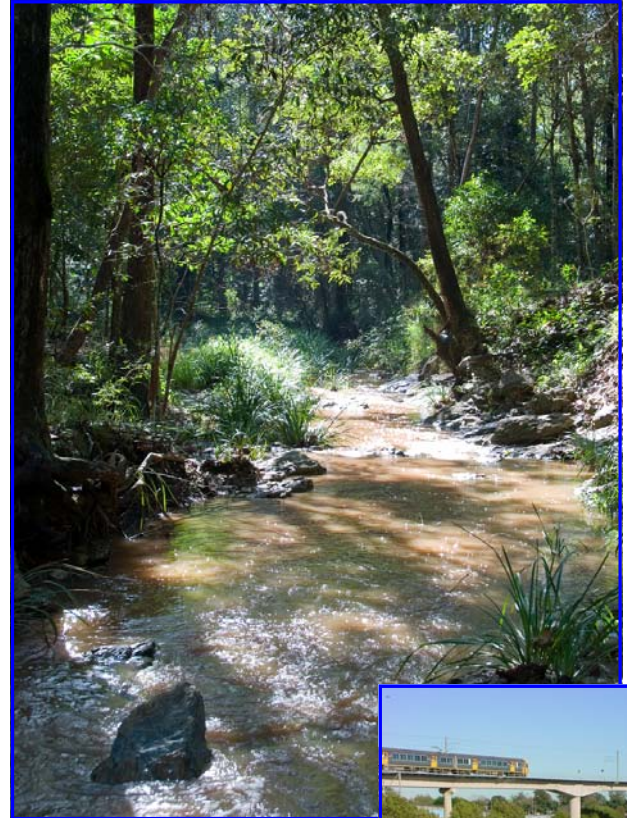

THE KEDRON BROOK CATCHMENT

Kedron Brook drains the coastal plain just north of Brisbane. Starting in the Brisbane Forest Park bushland, the Brook flows through a mostly urbanised catchment, briefly in Moreton Bay Regional Shire, then through the Brisbane City area. The mouth of the Brook is near Nudgee Beach on Moreton Bay; an area of international ecological significance.



WHAT IS THE KEDRON BROOK CATCHMENT BRANCH?

The Kedron Brook Branch of Wildlife Queensland aims to improve the environmental health of the Kedron Brook catchment. It is particularly interested in maintaining and improving the diversity of native plants and animals within the catchment.

It links groups and individuals with an interest in the environmental health of the Kedron Brook catchment through the Kedron Brook Catchment Network.

The Branch:

- promotes habitat improvement through restoration plantings and weed control, retaining riparian vegetation and improving water quality.
- encourages better natural area management.

- supports community environment groups (like Bushcare) working on public land.
- undertakes education and awareness activities with the community and in schools.
- maintains a network of land and water managers, people interested in the catchment, local governments and educational institutions.

As a Member of the Kedron Brook Catchment Branch, you can:

- meet and work with others of like mind to improve the quality and diversity of the flora and fauna in the Kedron Brook catchment.
- access wildlife and plant experts to learn about local flora and fauna.
- participate in regular branch meetings, community environmental education projects and wildlife workshops.
- receive personal accident and public liability insurance cover while undertaking branch activities.
- influence community opinion and government bodies to help protect the flora and fauna in the catchment from inappropriate development, land clearing and weed infestation.
- undertake projects to enhance the local environment and ensure there is a proper emphasis on environmental matters in planning and decision making.
- be part of an active and respected state-wide organisation with a proven record of caring for the wildlife and plants of Queensland.



ACTIVITIES IN THE CATCHMENT

The Branch gets significant support for projects and activities from the Brisbane City Council and project funding from state and federal agencies.

There are fifteen Bushcare groups in the catchment. Each group of volunteers works toward preserving and enhancing our parks and bushland by revegetation, controlling weeds, planting vegetation to encourage wildlife, and undertaking educational and social activities.

The Kedron Brook Catchment Network set up, maintains and regularly updates a website at www.kedronbrook.org.au with coordination provided through the Branch and its members.

On this website you will find information about the Brook; contact details and current group activities as well as educational material. The set up of the site was assisted and is maintained with support from the Brisbane City Council.

Through coordinated community effort, education and awareness, we aim to ensure our local environment is fit for us and future generations to enjoy.
