

## HAVE YOU SEEN OR HEARD THESE FROGS ?

### KEDRON BROOK FROG CENSUS 2009

These eight species of frogs live in the Kedron Brook catchment. Other species of Amphibians known to live in our catchment are the Tusked Frog, *Adelotus brevis* (considered as vulnerable), and of course the Cane Toad (*Bufo marinus*).

Historically, the Bleating Treefrog (*Litoria dentata*), the Broad-palmed Rocketfrog (*Litoria latopalmata*), the Spotted Marshfrog (*Limnodynastes tasmaniensis*), the Green-striped Frog (*Cyclorana alboguttata*), the Eastern Gungan (*Uperoleia laevigata*), and the Beeping Froglet (*Crinia parinsignifera*) have also been recorded.

Our Kedron Brook Frog Surveys are part of an on-going project started in 2007. We are interested in finding out what species of frog still exist in our catchment. The presence and welfare of frogs is an important indicator of water quality, the biodiversity of wildlife, and environmental health within a catchment.
